



Digital Welcome is a project for migrants and refugees. It developed a training programme combining different IT skills adapted to the needs of migrants and refugees.

We wanted those skills to be **useful**, **relevant** to their context and **help** them to integrate in the new country. The programme is for **young refugees** or **asylum seekers** who want to improve their **language** and **digital** skills.

The training is 60 hours and includes 4 modules:

- Introduction to coding
- Digital storytelling
- Digital journalism
- Soft skills and communication

Participants also learn how to animate workshops on those topics. At the end of the course, they organise IT workshops for local people or other refugees.
