The Digital Welcome programme is a program for young refugees or asylum seekers who want to improve their language skills and computer skills. You will follow a course of 60 hours in which you learn how to organise workshops on computer skills.

When you finish the course, you choose a group of people you want to work with as a volunteer.

Do you want to teach older people how to use a smartphone or a computer? Do you want to teach digital photography to children?

Do you dream of giving a coding workshop to other youngsters?

In Digital Welcome, you will be able to do all this, and more. We will help you define who you want to teach and how many hours of volunteer work you want to do.

Finally, you will make a digital story about your volunteer work. So, you can show the world what you can do.

Are you working with refugees and asylum seekers?

If you are an organisation or public institution working for the integration of refugees and asylum seekers, our methodology may be very useful for you.

We will develop and test it in April – July 2018. Then we will update it and share our experience with you. We want your help along the process.
